

Dear Friends and Partners of Kingdom Life Church Ministry. Once again I come to thank you for all your support.

Firstly Jackson and Hasifah want me to say a big thank you to everyone who contributed to their wedding. It was a wonderful day, not just for themselves but also for the village. Peter and Joan were able to come and join us for this occasion.



Secondly, at the last Board Meeting we had in Uganda, the Chairman, together with all the members wanted me to thank everyone who gave money to help following the destruction of many homes in Uganda. For those who didn't hear, 15 of our private boarders when taken home at the end of the first term, found their parents in tents and everything destroyed, both homes and crops. Hosea brought them straight back to school and I sent out an appeal for help with their school fees and food. Thank you so much to everyone who responded. We had more than enough to keep these children until the end of the year. This was a great blessing as due to the destruction of crops we had to buy beans from Rwanda and Maize from Tanzania. The extra we received allowed us to buy food for the rest of the School, Hope, and food for the village.

We have received many visitors this year which has been a blessing in many different ways. Helen visited just as my friend which was great. Shortly afterwards Paul and Lee came from Kingdom Life and Forefront Churches. They were able to have personal time with each of the senior staff and this was a great benefit and encouragement to them.



David Abbott followed which sadly is his last year to come to Uganda. We had a very precious time both with the young children and a reunion for the older ones who are now well into their teens or twenties. It was great to see how they have grown and developed: one is a trained nurse, one is a student nurse, one is studying pathology and one has her own tailoring business. Others are still in Senior School. All of them are still walking with the Lord Jesus. (Michael here is interpreting for David)

With all these visitors and others that followed we began to take the orphaned children and the children of our staff out for the day when we went to the Sailing club in Jinja. It was such a joy to see these children enjoying themselves. There is a play area with equipment which they loved, we took them out on a boat and of course gave them a good meal. Most of these children had never done anything like this before. We have done 5 trips this year and hope to continue next year.





Another blessing of visitors is that they bring an extra case with them with materials for tailoring, equipment for carpentry and for mechanics. Most of this is supplied by our friends, "Tools for Self-Reliance Northampton" and we are very grateful to them for their help. (Mechanics Tools shown in picture).

In my last letter I mentioned Jackson's desire to start a course for car mechanics and driving. This is now well under way. We have an old car for practice and numerous car parts that mean nothing to me. What we still need is a car in which they can be taught to drive. All the vehicles we have at the moment are automatic and we need a manual. Two of my "boys" have now joined the course and they are already talking about having "Kingdom Life Garage" in Busia!

We also had Christmas in March! Anne, my friend from Corbridge, came up with this idea and she organized most of it. We invited all our senior staff and their children and did a Christmas Party much as it would be done in UK, with games like Musical Chairs. We also had 2 other visitors at this time, Chris and Naomi. It was a great success and they are hoping that we will do it again next year.



The Church in Kasambira continues with Christopher as the Pastor but I believe we need an Assistant for him who perhaps would be able to take responsibility for the spiritual needs of the boarders at the school. At the moment he is Pastor both for the Church and for the School. He also oversees the Church at Buwenge which is growing slowly. The building now has a foundation and the walls are up about 6 feet.
