I am writing this in Hexham, where the Lord has established me since my return to the UK. Now I am having to adjust to a whole new way of life. I am living in a mobile home, on a hill, with a most beautiful view over Hexham. I am part of a very loving fellowship and making many new friends in Hexham and in the areas around.

This has been a very challenging time for the Ministry in Kasambira and I have kept in contact with Jackson on a regular basis. With lockdown much of the work has been suspended and they are in total lockdown again at the time of writing.

Although the departments have been closed much of the last 18 months, the candidate classes did resume for a while, so the Primary Leaving Exams and the O & A Level Exams went ahead.

They have been so grateful for your continued support and the special gifts sent during this time and as a result wages have been paid or partly paid and food has been supplied for many others who have been without a means to support themselves during lockdown.

I asked Jackson to send me a report of the situation in Uganda and with the ministry and here it is.



KINGDOM LIFE NURSERY AND PRIMARY SCHOOL

The school is still closed but we hope to be open soon.

We were able by God's grace to get 23 first grades and the rest were all second grades. 62 pupils in total took their final Primary Leaving Exams. We really praise God for such a performance.

As we are hoping to open soon, we will be in the field looking for more pupils and we need your prayers for this. Many of our private pupils have struggled to pay fees because of the situation in the country due to the pandemic and we ask your prayers

for them also and generally for finance for the school to support them at this time.




HOPE VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE

Hope is still closed also but we hope to open up at the same time as the school.

The vocational training school was also opened for a short time for preparation for the finals for the candidate classes, but the results have not yet been released in the entire country.

Hope is in the same situation as the school. Many have not been able to pay their fees or provide their equipment. We are also looking for new students for the coming year and for finance to help support them.



SENIORS

Most of the pupils we supported in Senior school preparing for their O Level Exams passed in Division 2 although we have not been able to contact all of them due to lockdown.

NOTE

All teachers are being vaccinated country wide and after them the pupils will be next, in the hope that the school will not be a breeding ground for a further outbreak of the virus.

JANET'S BOYS

Alex and Andrew have completed their courses at Hope and are waiting for their results.

All the boys are happy and thankful for the money sent to help them through this time. Please pray they will get better jobs for their wellbeing.

ADMIN

The leaders and other workers are doing well, and we all want to say thank you for the financial support we have been given during lockdown.

The season was poor for harvesting, therefore, people keep on coming to us asking for help. Please pray that the next season will be better.

The churches are still closed. However, Pastor Chris visits members of the church very often and prays with them and encourages them.
